WALL OF HONOR AWARDS

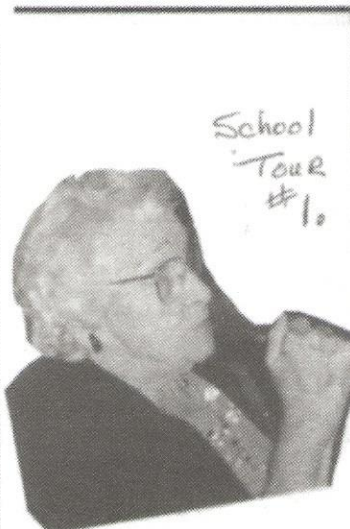
